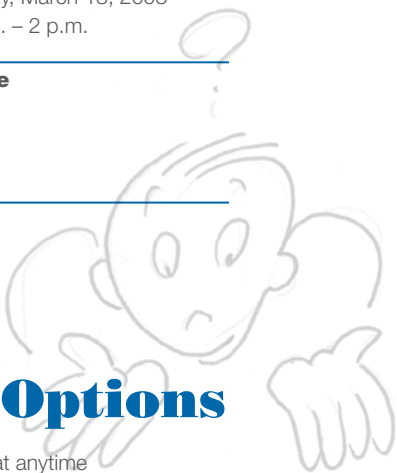

Step 1

View Room Draw Number

Start Date: Monday, February 11, 2008

Deadline for Completion: Wednesday, March 5, 2008

Location: www.housing.cmu.edu

Data Required: Andrew ID

- To complete Step 1, residents will need to visit our web site, www.housing.cmu.edu, between February 11 and March 5.
- Random room draw numbers will be generated upon authentication into the system as confirmation of participation. Many residents base their decision to retain or select rooms according to these numbers.

Step 2

Housing Reservation Fee & Housing License Agreement

Amount: \$300 (the student account will be charged in July)

Start Date: Monday, February 11, 2008

Deadline for Completion: Wednesday, March 5, 2008, 4:59 p.m.

Location: www.housing.cmu.edu

Data Required: Andrew ID

- Current residents who plan to remain in university housing for the 2008-2009 academic year must meet the \$300 housing reservation fee requirement and electronically sign a Housing License Agreement online by Wednesday, March 5, 2008.
- Completion of the online reservation fee form authorizes Housing & Dining Services to charge your student account \$300 in July 2008. This fee is not refundable for any reason after May 16, 2008.

Step 3

Room Retention/Selection

Prerequisite: Completion of Step 1 & 2

Start Date: Monday, February 11, 2008

Deadline for Completion: Wednesday, February 20, 2008, 4:59 p.m. for room retention, Wednesday, March 5, 2008, 4:59 p.m. to participate in room selection

Location: www.housing.cmu.edu

Data Required: Andrew ID

- All residents participating in room draw will need to complete all four steps of the online process by March 5, 2008.
- Residents of rooms identified as resident assistant (RA), community assistant (CA), first-year and special interest housing are not eligible to retain. These residents must participate in selection unless otherwise contacted by Housing & Dining Services. Please see "Things to Consider" page 12, for first-year housing areas.

Retention Policies

- Any resident wishing to retain a room must do so online before 4:59 p.m. on Wednesday, February 20, 2008. Residents will not be permitted to retain their current room after this date.
- The above policy will be firmly adhered to. Any spaces that are not retained by the February 20, 2008 deadline will be eligible to be filled with pull-ins by those individuals who retained. There will be no exceptions to this policy, so please meet the posted deadlines.
- Residents who choose to retain their rooms cannot change their room draw option after 4:59 p.m. on February 20, 2008.

The information saved at this time is what will be processed for this phase of room draw. Residents are only permitted to participate in one phase of room draw – either retention or selection.

- Housing & Dining Services maintains the right to reassign any space that becomes available due to a resident changing rooms or canceling his/her housing license agreement. Residents have pull-in rights at the time of retention or selection. After the selection phase of room draw, pull-in requests will only be granted at the discretion of Housing & Dining Services.

Option 3a

Participating in Room Selection or another phase of room draw

Residents who are participating in general room selection, group housing, building retention, special interest housing, resident assistant/community assistant selection, or are planning on being pulled-into a vacancy in a room should select this option.

Select the following box on the online form by 4:59 p.m. on Wednesday, March 5, 2008.

- I am **NOT** retaining my current space (MOREWOOD GARDENS E 109) and will proceed to Room Selection or another phase of room draw.

Option 3b

Retaining Your Current Space

Deadline: February 20, 2008

All residents interested in retaining their current space should select this option prior to 4:59 p.m. on Wednesday, February 20, 2008. Check the following box online.

Room Retention with Pull-Ins

All roommates within a room, apartment or suite must be in agreement regarding any roommates being pulled-into the living area, and must have retained their current room before the deadline stated above. All retaining residents who wish to pull-in additional roommates should come to Housing and Dining Services with their desired new roommates (pull-ins) during business hours on the designated day for that building (see schedule below.) Roommates who are unable to attend must sign the "Pull-in Agreement form," available on the Housing and Dining Services website.

Notes:

- If you are interested in possibly retaining your room, but are also considering the possibility of being pulled-in by someone else who is retaining with a vacancy in their room, we recommend that you retain your room during this step (as a back-up plan) and participate in the pull-in process during the scheduled time.
- Residents who have retained their current room cannot change their room draw option after February 20, 2008, unless they are being pulled in by someone else who has retained (as detailed above.)
- Residents in Mudge who are retaining their current rooms or participating in building retention are not permitted to pull-in roommates unless they are current Mudge residents. Please see "Things to Consider" on page 12 for more information.

Step 4

Confirmation of Participation

After successfully completing all 4 steps, a confirmation page will be displayed. Students should print and save this confirmation page for their records.

Other Housing Options

(All residents participating in any of the housing options below must complete all four steps of the online process.)

Group Housing Option

Prerequisite: Completion of Steps 1-4 by all group members
Application submitted prior to Wednesday, March 5, 2008

Date: Tuesday, March 18, 2008

Time: Participants will be notified of the selection time schedule via email

Location: TBA

- This housing option accommodates the desires of groups of individuals who would like to live together. Groups of no less than six and no more than 16 are permitted to apply for a block of rooms.
- Most group housing blocks will be located in the Oakland Community Apartments. However, some blocks may be available on campus.
- Applications are available in the Housing & Dining Services Office and must be submitted by Wednesday, March 5, 2008.
- Members of a group housing unit should not retain their room, and instead should select option 3A of the online process.
- Housing blocks are identified after the room retention process.
- Each group is required to elect a representative to be contacted regarding available housing blocks and selection order. That contact will also receive the selection time schedule to select their block of rooms.
- The group representative is required to have a signed proxy form for each group member at the time the block is selected.
- Residents belonging to groups that do not select a block will have the opportunity to participate in the open selection process.

Housing

Building Retention (By invitation only)

Prerequisite: Notification to participate, Completion of Steps 1-4

Date: Wednesday, March 19, 2008

Time: Participants will be notified of the selection time schedule via email

Location: West Wing Recreation Room

- Building retention is held after room retention and allows displaced residents of first-year areas in designated houses to choose a same room type accommodation within the same building. The process is similar to selection and is based on the resident's class and random number.
- Building Retention selection order is based on class standing and room draw number.
- Residents eligible to participate will be notified by email of the selection time schedule. Eligible residents include first-year students in the following areas: Henderson 1st floor, Welch 1st floor, McGill 1st floor, Scobell ground and 1st floors and Mudge floors B basement, B1, C basement and C1.*

* Mudge residents are eligible to retain their building but cannot pull-in roommates who are not current Mudge residents.
- Morewood E Tower, Hamerschlag House, PLACE House, Donner House, Boss House & New House are non-retainable. Current residents are not included in building retention and should participate in room selection.
- Residents that are eligible to participate or are being pulled-in but cannot be present must give their proxy form to the person participating on their behalf. The proxy form was distributed with this brochure and is also available on the Room Draw Resources page at www.housing.cmu.edu.

Selection for Displaced Residents (By invitation only)

Prerequisite: Prior notification to attend; Completion of Steps 1-4

Date: Thursday, March 20, 2008

Time: Participants will be notified of their selection time via email

Location: West Wing Recreation Room

- Some residents may be notified in advance of Room Draw that they are not eligible to retain their room and will be invited to this selection day to give them an opportunity to select comparable accommodations.

Room Selection

Prerequisite: Completion of Steps 1-4

Date: Monday, March 24 – Thursday, March 27, 2008

Time: According to lottery number, see page 10

Location: West Wing Recreation Room

- Only residents who have met the housing reservation fee requirement, signed their Housing License Agreement online, and did not already select a space through the retention or pull-in process are permitted to participate in room selection.
- Order of selection is determined first by class level, then by order of distributed random numbers. Random numbers were received in Step 1.

Room Selection Procedure - with no pull-ins

- Review available spaces through the online look-up located at www.housing.cmu.edu beginning Monday, March 17, 2008. Keep in mind that changes will be made to the database over the course of the week.
- Arrive on time at the West Wing Recreation Room with a picture ID card. If you are unavailable at your scheduled time, send a designee with the above items and a proxy form.
- Check in and receive your selection card.
- Navigate easily through your room selection with the assistance of our staff.

Room Selection Procedure – with pull-ins

- Identify the person among potential roommates with the better lottery number.
- Review available spaces through the online look-up located at www.housing.cmu.edu beginning Monday, March 17, 2008. Keep in mind that changes will be made to the database over the course of the week.
- Arrive on time at the West Wing Recreation Room on the day scheduled for the lottery number. You are required to prepare a prioritized list and each individual is required to present a picture ID card. If you are unavailable at the scheduled time, send a designee with the above items and a proxy form.
- Check in and receive your selection card (each individual is required to check in).
- Navigate easily through your room selection with the assistance of our staff.

Selection Schedules

In order to maximize efficiency, selection schedules will be created after the retention process and pull-in process and sent to all eligible residents via email. Copies of the selection schedule will also be posted online and available in the Housing and Dining Services office. Selection schedules will be available online beginning March 17, 2008.

Residents are required to be present at the beginning of their assigned time. Those residents arriving after their number has been called are required to go to the head of the line of the next group waiting to enter the selection room.

(Note: The dates listed below are different from the dates originally published in the Room Draw brochure sent out during Winter Break.)

Students will be assigned a Room Selection time on one of the following days:

Monday, March 24 – Selection Day 1

Tuesday, March 25 – Selection Day 2

Wednesday, March 26 – Selection Day 3

Thursday, March 27 – Selection Day 4

Rate Information

Housing rates for the 2008-2009 academic year will be posted on the Housing and Dining Services website when they are made available.

Residents should not expect an increase of more than 4 to 6 percent.

Important Selection Policies

- A resident who does not designate a roommate may not select a vacant room if a half-filled room is available.
- Residents are required to be present at the beginning of their assigned time. Those individuals arriving after their number has been called are required to go to the head of the line of the next group waiting to enter the selection room.
- Residents will have a limited amount of time to select a room. If an individual has difficulties deciding, the next resident in line may move forward and select a room.
- Residents may pull in roommates (in any residence hall, suite or apartment) or housemates (Margaret Morrison or Roselawn) provided the pull-in resident is also present. If the pull-in resident(s) cannot be present, a signed proxy form and a picture ID card for the individual must be provided at the time of designation. All pull-in residents must have fulfilled the necessary reservation fee and Housing License Agreement requirements.
- Housing & Dining Services maintains the right to reassign any space that becomes available due to a resident changing rooms or canceling his/her housing license agreement. Residents have pull-in rights at the time of retention or selection. After the selection phase of room draw, pull-in requests will only be granted at the discretion of Housing & Dining Services.

Cancellation

Cancellation of the Housing Reservation Fee and/or Room Assignment

Location: Online at www.housing.cmu.edu

Eligibility

- Residents who choose not to reside in campus housing after meeting the \$300 housing reservation fee requirement and confirming a space **MUST** request a refund of the fee and cancellation before the deadline using the online cancellation form located on the Housing & Dining Services Web site.
- The reservation fee is not charged if a room is not retained or selected.

Dates

March 31 through April 25 (at 4:59 p.m.) – Residents can cancel their housing contracts for a full refund of housing charges outlined in the HLA including the \$300 housing reservation fee.

April 25 (at 5 p.m.) through May 16 (4:59 p.m.) – Residents can cancel their housing contracts for a full refund of housing charges outlined in the HLA but will forfeit the \$300 housing reservation fee.

After May 16 at 5 p.m. – Residents will NOT be permitted to cancel their housing license agreement, and will be held financially responsible for all housing charges, including the \$300 housing reservation fee. Exceptions will be made for students who are leaving the university due to leave of absence, withdrawal, financial or academic suspension, but the \$300 housing reservation fee will not be refunded. Residents should not sign leases for off-campus apartments after May 16, 2008 as they will NOT be released from their university housing agreements. University housing contracts are for the academic year (both fall and spring semesters).

If you cancel, it is your responsibility to retain the cancellation confirmation email, which will be sent to you. Please keep this email should you need to prove cancellation in the future. Residents are responsible for all housing costs if they do not request a cancellation before May 16, 2008.

Consolidation

After the Room Draw process has concluded, residents without roommates or whose roommates cancel their reservations throughout the remainder of the spring semester will be consolidated with other individuals in the same situation. Residents will be consolidated within building and specific room type. Residents will be notified through email when this situation occurs and will have an opportunity to look at the roster for possibilities of consolidation. If necessary, consolidation will be determined by gender, class standing and random number.

Consolidation will continue over the summer months so that we can successfully address the wait list and first-year student housing needs. While we'll make every effort to contact residents who are consolidated over the summer, there are some cases where contact is not possible.

Things to Consider

Boss House

Beginning Fall 2008, Boss House will be an all first-year building. Residents of Boss House will not be able to retain their rooms. Residents should participate in general selection in order to choose a different living accommodation.

Scobell House

Beginning Fall 2009, Scobell House will be an all first-year building. Current residents of floors 2 and 3 can choose to retain their current room or participate in building retention to select a different space within Scobell (including singles.) Residents of the ground and first floors can only retain their rooms if currently residing in singles; residents in double rooms can participate in building retention to select a different space on an upper floor of Scobell. All Scobell residents wishing to remain in university housing during room draw 2009 will have to participate in general selection in order to select a room.

Mudge House

Beginning Fall 2009, Mudge House will be an all first-year building. Mudge House will be a living option for current Mudge residents only. During room draw 2009, all Mudge residents will be required to participate in general selection in order to choose a new living space.

The following applies to current residents of Mudge House:

- **Retainers**

Current Mudge residents residing in A tower (all floors), B tower (floors 2 and 3), and C tower (floors 2 and 3) are permitted to retain their current rooms during the online room draw process (by February 20, 2008). Additionally, residents in single rooms on the ground and first floors of B and C tower are permitted to retain.

- **Pull-ins**

Residents of Mudge who are retaining their current space and have a vacancy within their room may pull-in a roommate as long as that person is a current Mudge resident.

- **Building Retention**

Residents who live on the ground or first floors of Mudge B and C towers will be permitted to participate in building retention to select a space on a different floor of Mudge.

Residents of all other floors/towers are also permitted to participate in building retention to select a different room within Mudge – including singles – if they wish. Building retention selection will occur in order of class standing and room draw number.

First-Year Housing Areas

The following areas are identified as first-year housing for the 2008-2009 academic year and are not available for retention or selection.

Proxy Forms

Proxy forms are required if you are sending a designee to select your room for you. Your proxy must have your picture ID card when selecting your room. Proxy forms are available on the Room Draw Resources page located at www.housing.cmu.edu.

Quiet Living Areas

Welch House and all Oakland Community Apartments are designated as quiet living environments.

Resnik and West Wing Rooms

Residents selecting rooms facing the stadium should be aware that activities (including early morning hours) might create excessive noise.

Smoke-Free Living Areas

All residential buildings are designated smoke-free with the exception of Fairfax and Webster.

Street Parking Permits

Only residents of Cathedral Mansions, Neville Co-op and Shady Oak are eligible for street parking permits. Verification of residency is available through Housing & Dining Services. Email plaid@andrew.cmu.edu for further information.

Substance-Free Building

Henderson House is designated as a substance-free building. Residents selecting Henderson House will be required to sign a Wellness Agreement.

Summer Housing

Donner House is the primary area used for summer housing but current residents retaining for fall in Cathedral Mansions*, Fairfax Apartments, and Webster Apartments are permitted to apply for summer housing in those buildings. There is a charge for summer housing. See the Housing & Dining Services Web site in March for deadlines and more information.

* Cathedral Mansions residents pay the management office directly for June and July.

Wait Lists

Residents will have the opportunity to put their names on waiting lists for room types that are unavailable to them through Room Draw. Details will be available at room selection.

Winter Break Housing

Winter break housing is available in Cathedral Mansions, Fairfax Apartments, Morewood Gardens and Webster Apartments. Other buildings will not be open for any portion of winter break and you are required to seek alternative housing arrangements.

Notes

Multi-bedroom Houses and Apartments

Based on student feedback, during Room Draw 2008, residents who select an assignment in multi-bedroom houses and apartments (such as Cathedral Mansions two bedroom apartments, Roselawn houses, Shady Oak two bedrooms apartments, Webster two bedroom apartments and Woodlawn apartments) will select and be assigned to a specific room within the unit – in most cases to either the single or double room. Residents assigned to the single rooms within these units will pay an apartment single room rate, and will be guaranteed the single room as their place of residence. Exact rates for these rooms will be available in February on the Housing and Dining Services website and in the office.
